# Woodhill History



## The History of Woodhill Homes

Woodhill Homes is a public housing facility that was built in the late 1930s. The first people to have resided at Woodhill consisted of mostly white immigrants. Over nearly two decades the demographic shifted to primarily African American residents. This change was due to a few factors such as redlining, white flight, construction, and more. The demographic wasn't the only shift that Woodhill saw, "shifts in the financing structure of public housing led to increasingly deteriorated living conditions and decreased safety in CMHA properties" (HUD Needs Assessment). In the 1960s, Woodhill went through a period of riots, segregation, and

white supremacy causing tensions to be high and dangerous. Today's residents continue to harbor resentment towards each other and especially law enforcement.

Woodhill has been stuck in its deteriorated state for decades. A few changes have been made but nothing of significance has greatly improved the quality of life for Woodhill residents.

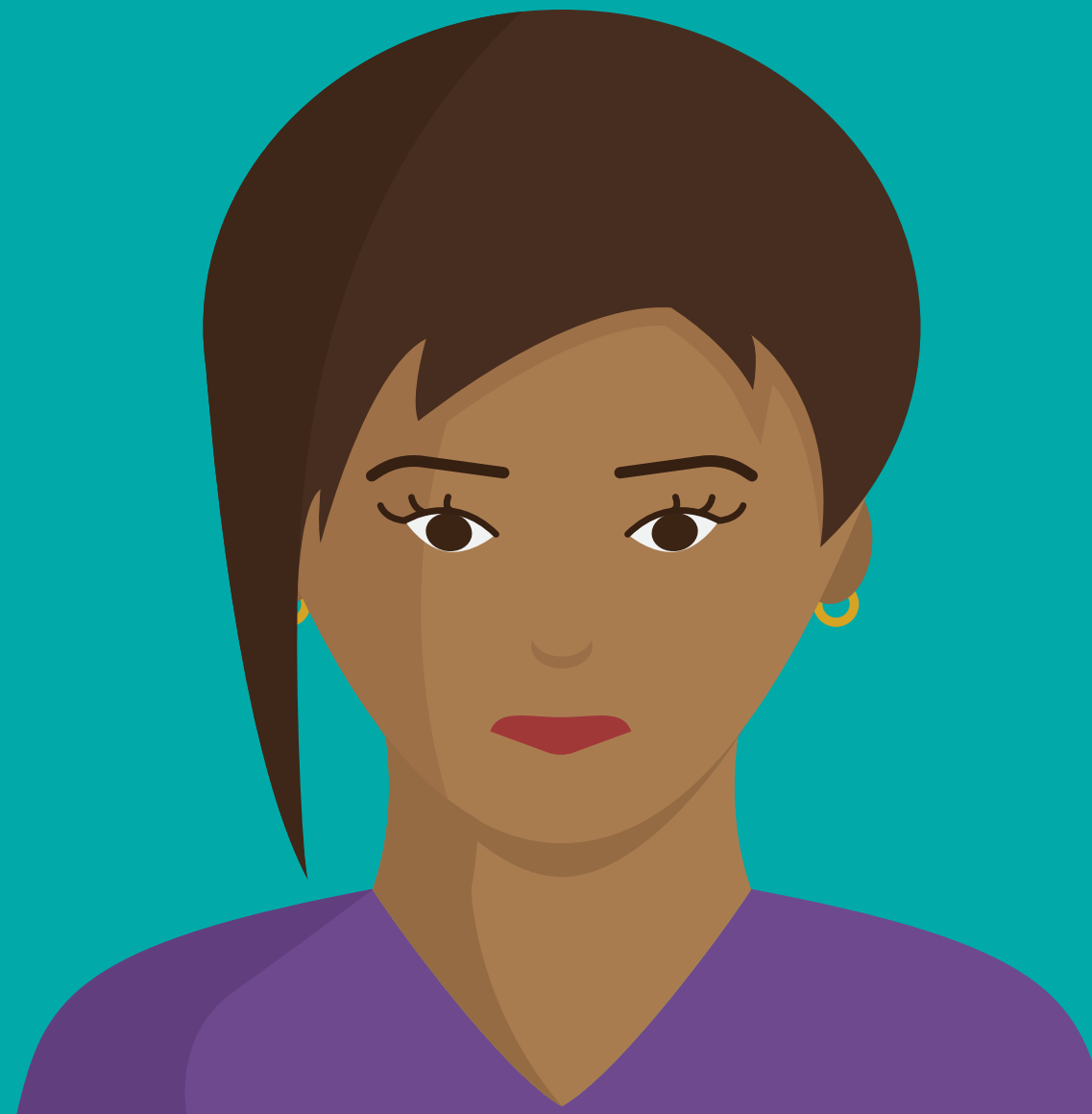

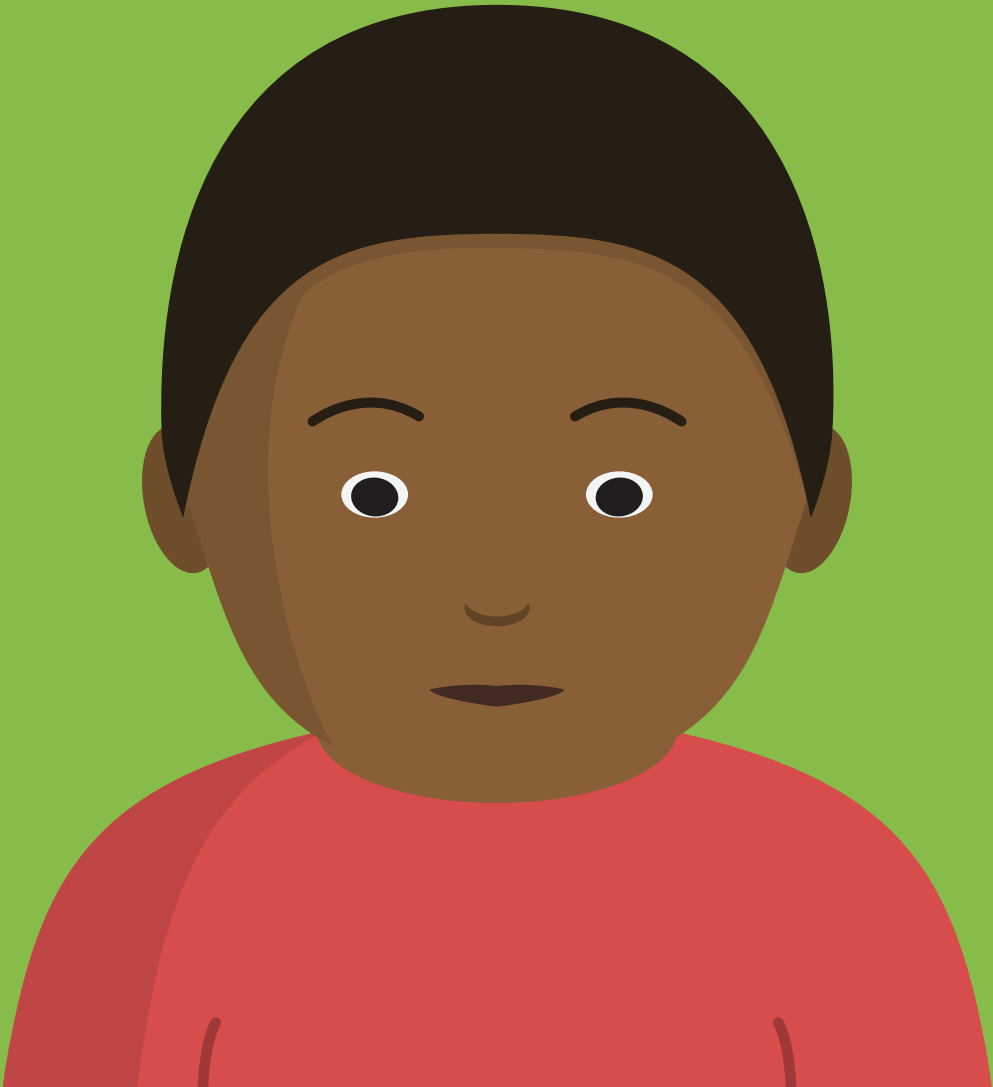

As a team, we have come up with two distinct solutions that address the needs of Woodhill residents.

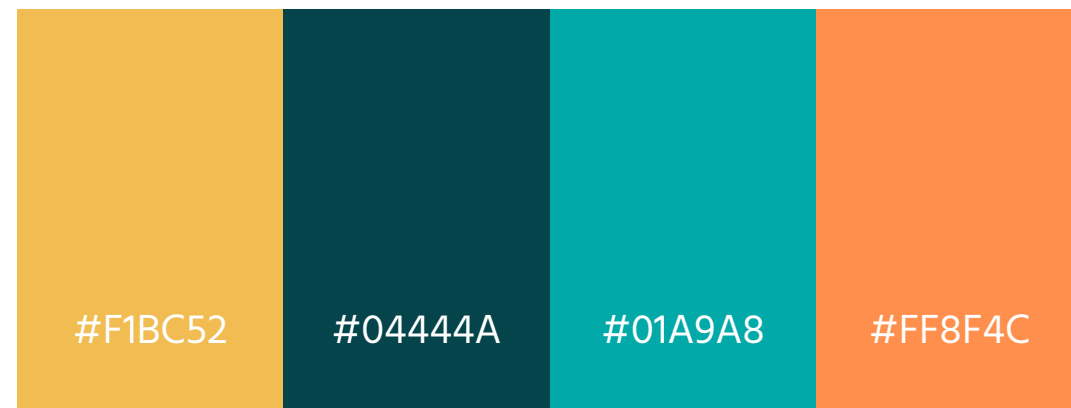
**Solution A** addresses the needs of adult and elderly residents, whereas **Solution B** addresses the needs of children under 5 and parents.

## Vibrant and Visible

The colors were chosen because they convey a feeling of energy and warmth. Combinations of some of these colors create high contrast, which aids in legibility.

Hind by Indian Type Foundry has simple but well-defined letterforms that are easy for both children and older residents to read, even from afar.

The branding system also incorporates a hill motif, a literal interpretation of the name of the community.

# Signage **Street Sign**



## "Morris Black"

Nearly half of the residents refer to the community as "Morris Black," which is the previous name of the community and also the name of its adjacent street. In an effort to maintain some sense of the community's identity, the street sign was incorporated into the rebrand solutions.

## Community and Awareness

While Woodhill Homes has resident meetings, many do not or are unable to attend. The property also lacks seating areas outdoors.

This bench addresses both concerns, providing places for residents to sit, chat or hang out. Because each bench will have different information, strategic placement of the benches encourages exploration of the community.



Roof protects users from sun and rain.

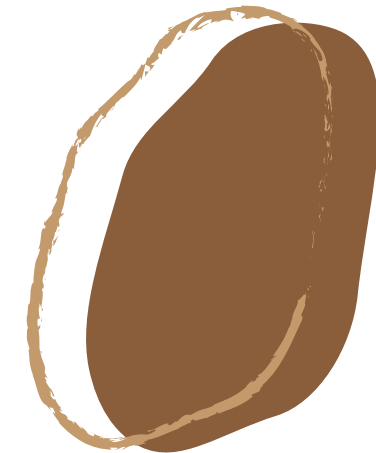

### TOMATO & BASIL PASTA

Serving size: 3-4

- Olive oil
- Pasta
- Basil
- Roma tomatoes
- Garlic

Estimated total = \$8.97 - \$10

Start by boiling the pasta, & then chop the tomatoes, basil & garlic. Add the tomatoes, basil & garlic in a separate bowl. Add some salt & pepper & parsley flake seasoning (optional) to the bowl with the other ingredients. Once the pasta is done cooking, drain the water & add the mixture to the pasta. Transfer to a plate & you're done! Garnish parmesan cheese on top (optional).

### PINTO BEAN & RICE TACOS

Serving size: 4-5

- White rice 2lbs
- Pinto beans
- Shredded cheese 16oz
- Roma tomatoes
- Tortillas 20cnt
- Salsa 16oz (optional)

Estimated total = \$7 - \$8

In a skillet, heat the oil over medium heat. Add the oil & beans to cook until soft for about four minutes. Once the rice is done cooking, add the rice into the bowl. On top, add beans, tomatoes, cheese & salsa (optional). You could enjoy this meal as a rice bowl with a torilla on the side or load all the ingredients inside the tortilla for a taco style.

### LEMON GARLIC ZUCCHINI

Serving size: 3-4

- Butter 2 sticks
- Minced garlic 8oz
- Italian seasoning .77oz
- Salt & pepper
- Parsley leaves
- Lemon

Estimated total = \$8.81 - \$9

In a small bowl, whisk together butter, garlic, Italian seasoning & lemon juice; season with salt & pepper, for taste. Brush zucchini slices with butter mixture. Then, heat a grill pan over medium high heat. Add zucchini in a single layer & grill until charred on both sides & just beginning to soften, about 2 minutes per side. Serve immediately, garnished with parsley, if desired.

### POTATO HASH

Serving size: 4

- Potatoes
  - Red bell pepper
  - Onion
  - Bacon
  - Olive oil
  - Salt & pepper
  - Fried egg 18cnt
- Estimated total = \$10 - \$11

Dice the potatoes, onions, red bell peppers & bacon. Boil the potatoes for approximately 5-10 minutes in a pot of boiling water. You'll know they're ready when they can be easily pierced with a knife or fork. Drain them from the water and set them aside. Crisp the bacon over medium-high heat. Add olive oil to the pan, & add the onions & red bell peppers to the pan. Season with a pinch of salt & pepper, then add potatoes once the onions & peppers begin to brown. Once everything looks crispy, garnish with a fried egg.

# SOLUTION B

## EDUCATIONAL GAME

# Long Term Goal

Target the lack of kindergarten readiness in the community by creating an educational tool that was personalized to the needs and challenges that these families face.

# Research Problem and Solution

- 27.6% of the 250 survey respondents, reported having children who were not yet enrolled in kindergarten
- 92.1% of children entering kindergarten are not equipped with the skills they will need to be ready to succeed in kindergarten
- 45.5% children ages 0–5 are registered in early learning programs
- 16.7% of all children ages 0–4 participated in a high quality early learning program
- 48% were interested literacy development programs

In order to prepare the young minds of the Woodhill community for Kindergarten, we researched the Ohio education standards and requirements that Pre-Kindergarteners need to know by the time they enter Kindergarten.

While there are many tools out on the market that do this, we wanted to cater to the challenges and difficulties this community faces with obtaining proper early childhood education.

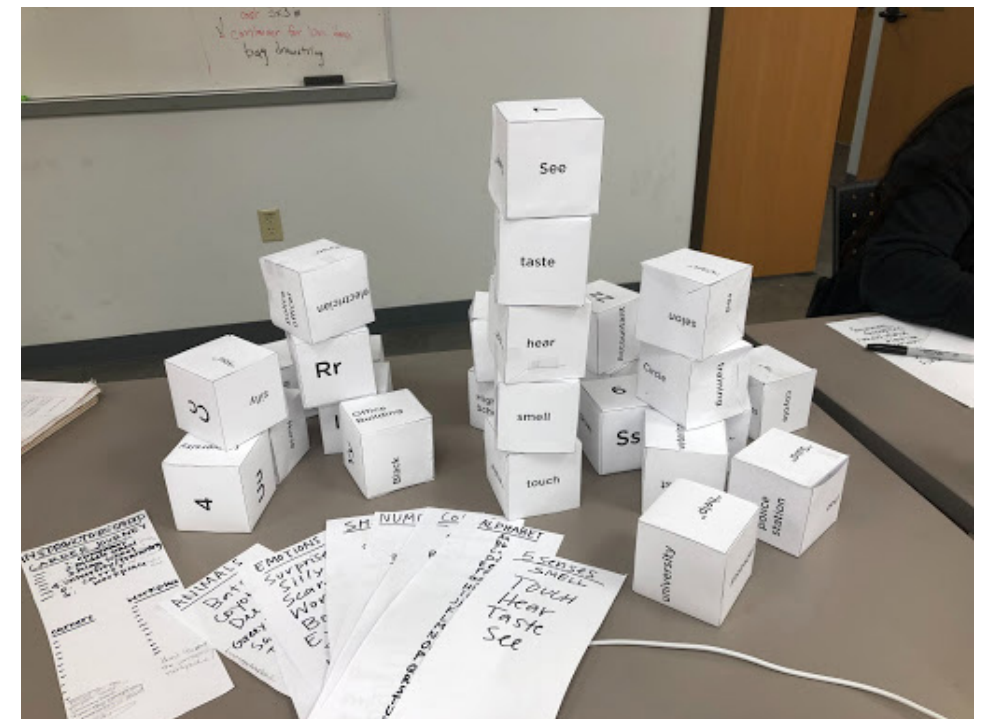
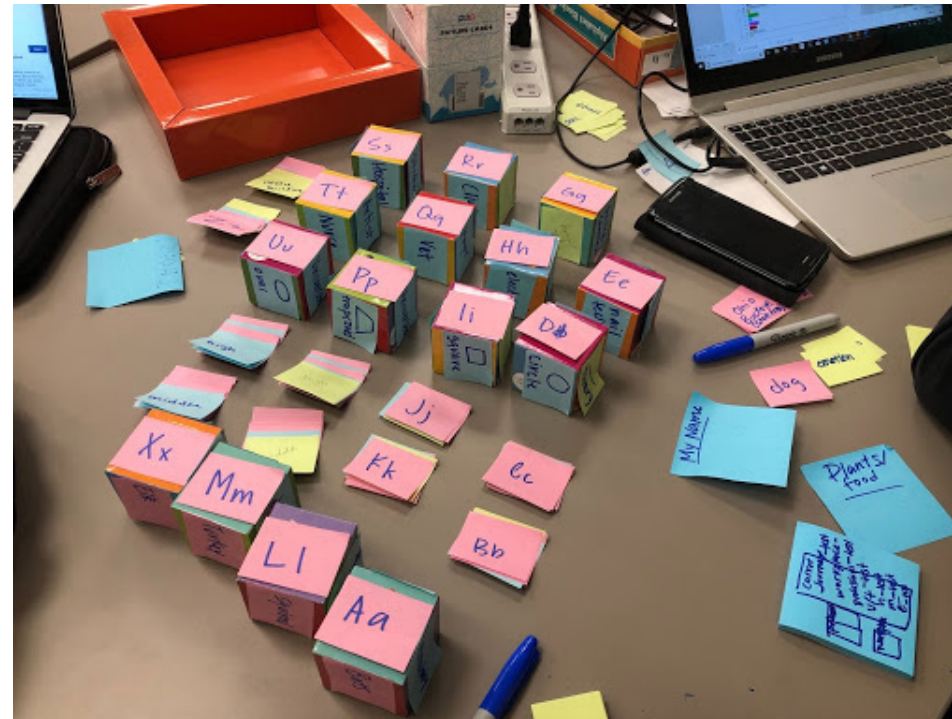
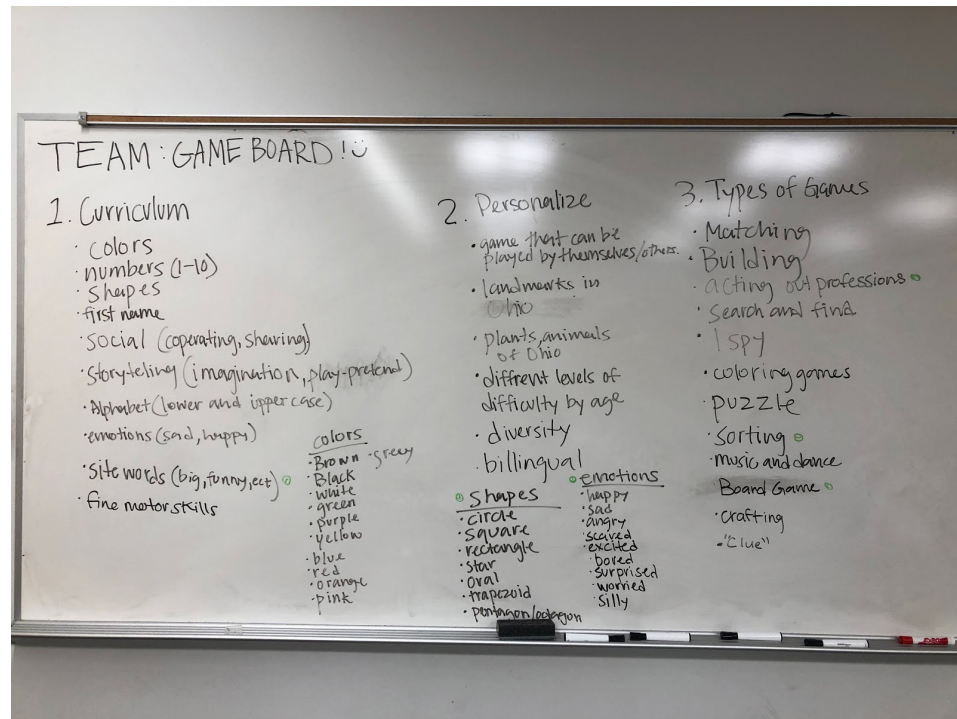
## Strategy

Creating an inexpensive game that not only pushes collaboration and engagement with families, but also encourages self-fulfillment among young children. All in an effort to increase education and boost morale.

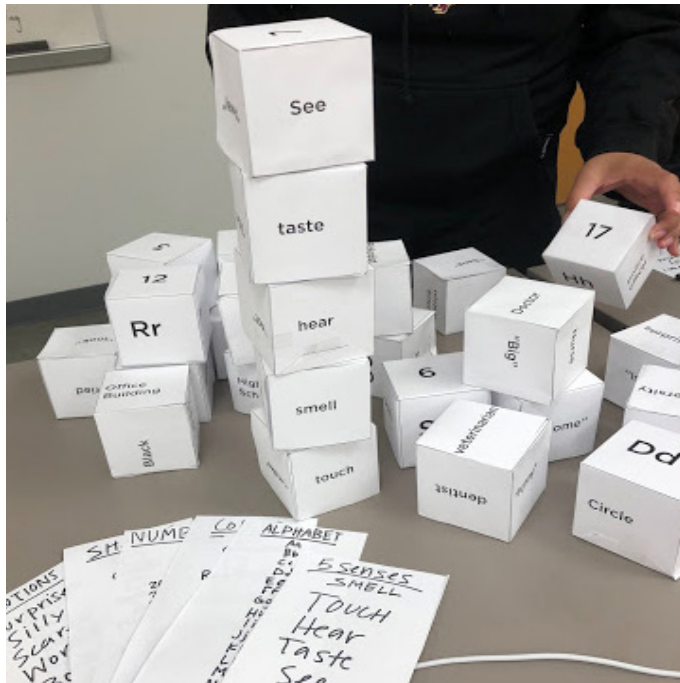

**Alteration of blocks** so they would not be too heavy for little Shawn to carry.

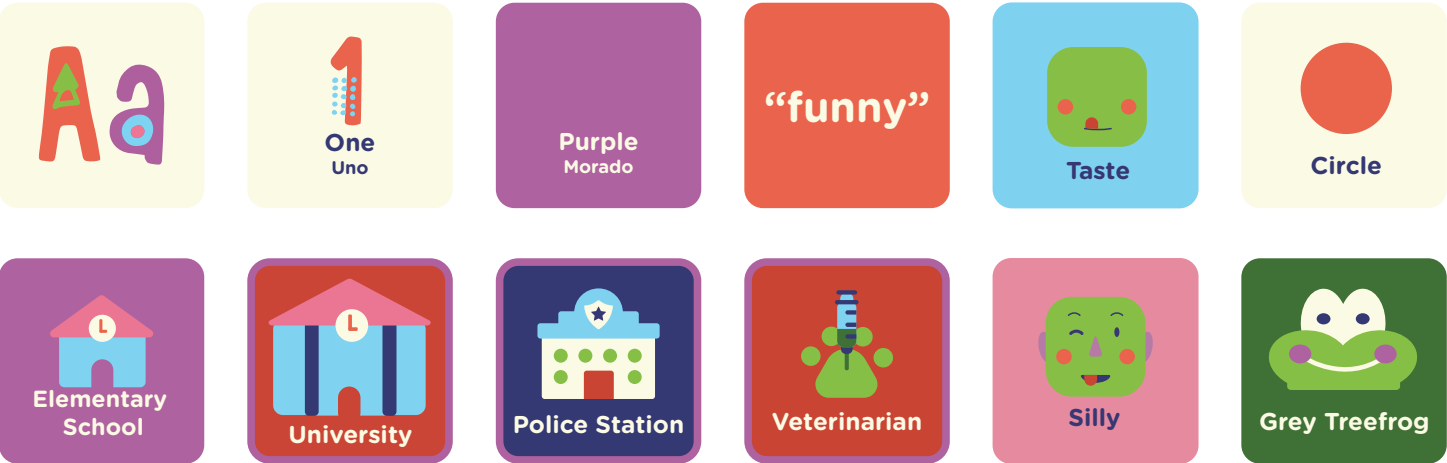
**Concise instructions** for Tahara and Grandma Geegee to read through effortlessly.

## Playful and Engaging

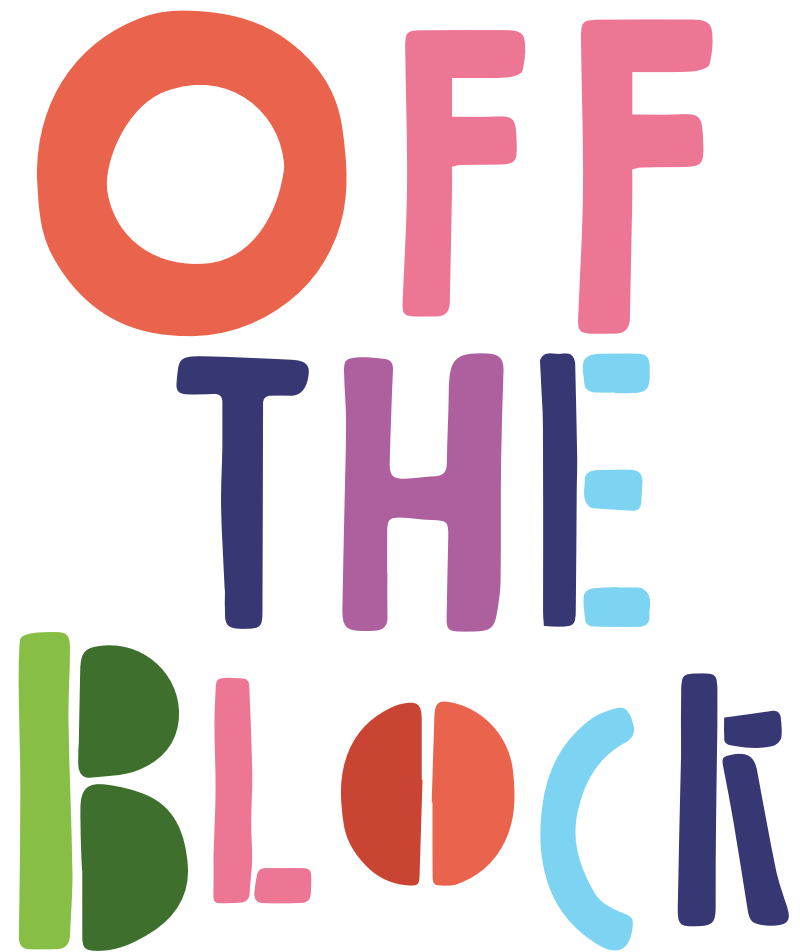
The display font for the *Off the Block* logo is a hand-rendered type specimen based off of the font *Childish Reverie*, chosen for its inviting, playful and youthful style.

The primary font and secondary fonts, Gotham Rounded Bold and Proxima Nova, were selected based on their legibility and rounded playfulness.

The colors chosen were a combination of warm and cool vibrant tones that engage the user.

The illustration style of geometric shapes used to build the graphics keep objects consistent and clean while maintaining a playful style.

## How to play

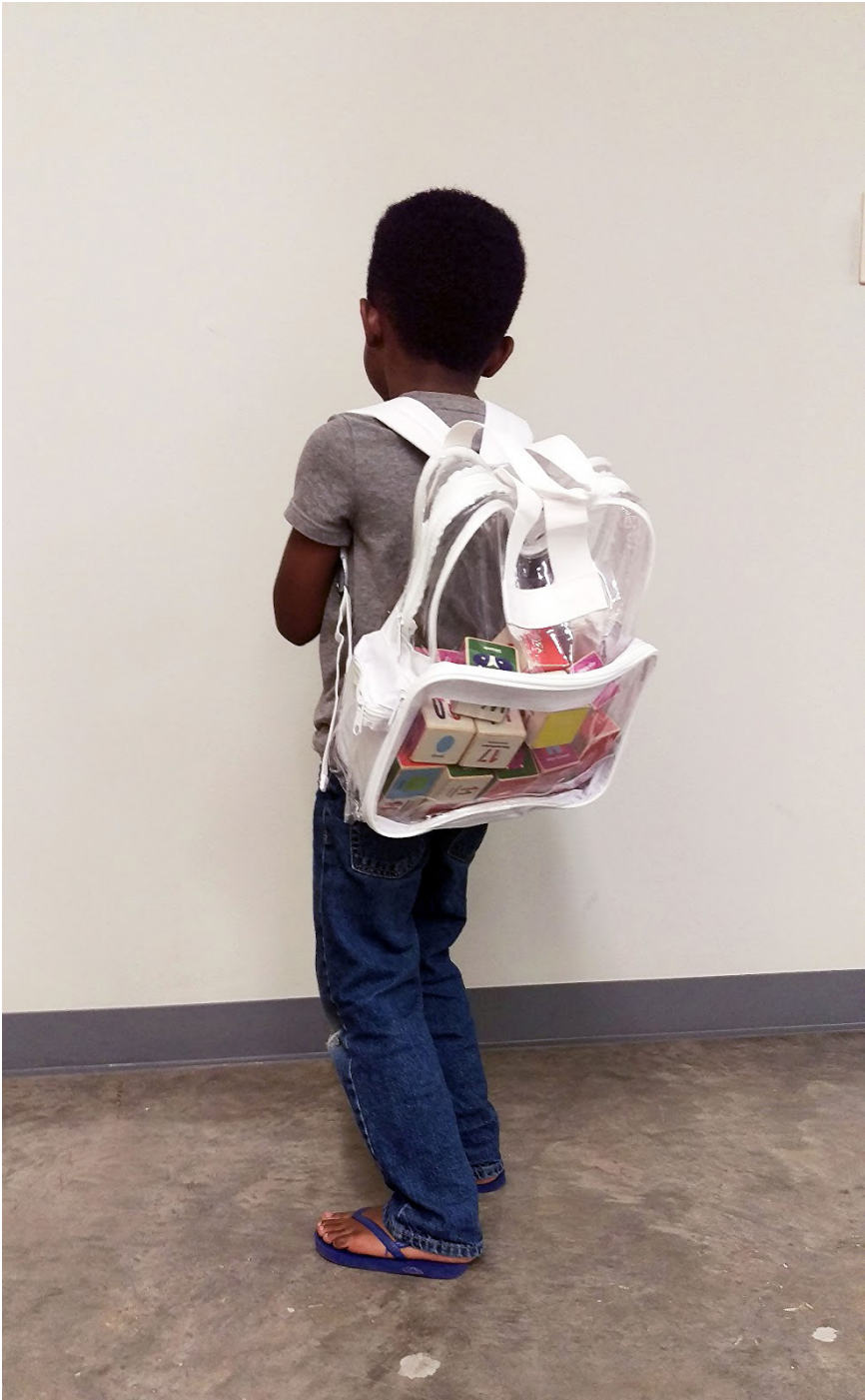
